## GUY STUFF

Corsicana has so many things to see and do that I decided to forgo the usual technical seminar on Saturday in favor of a visit to a museum about technology. I discovered by research on the web that there is a telephone industry museum in Corsicana owned and operated by a retired Western Electric employee. Since I worked for Southwestern Bell for 30 years I knew I would find the tour to be interesting and informative and I hoped some members of the RRR would also enjoy a tour of the museum.
Our tour of the Capehart Communications Collection was lead by Don Capehart. Don retired from Western Electric, which was the manufacturing and installation arm of the Bell System before the breakup of the Bell System in 1984. After that time they were owned by AT\&T until they were spun off as Lucent Technologies in 1996. Don's presentation was both interesting and entertaining. To call the collection a communications collection is a bit understated. Don not only has examples of telecommunications equipment from Western Electric but also many other companies both domestic and foreign.
Much to my surprise, Western Electric also used to make home and commercial appliances. The U.S. government forced them to split off all non-communication based equipment manufactured goods back in the 1920's. The company that was formed to continue those goods was Graybar. I have been in a Greybar store and never knew that they were once part of the Bell System.
Everyone who attended agreed that the tour was great fun. The
tour is free and by appointment only. If you didn't get to attend and find yourself in Corsicana with a couple of hours to spare, you should go and see Don's collection and visit with him.

On Friday a small group of RRRs went to the Corsicana Field Aviation Heritage Foundation. We were lucky to arrive in time to watch the installation crew put the final touches on the new statue honoring the Army Air Corp trainees who trained there starting in 1941. At present the Foundation's collection consists of two small rooms in the Municipal Airport Building with maps, photos, old newspaper articles, and various items used by the trainees and their trainers. Sarah Farley runs the airport FBO (Fixed Base Operator) and is happy to answer questions about the items in the memorabilia rooms. Her husband Gary Farley an A \& P mechanic (Airframe and Powerplant) leads the tour when you get to the hanger to see the vintage planes that are examples of the craft used for training during the camp's operational days.

There are two examples of the PT19, which was the primary trainer and both are airworthy. There are also several other planes from that era stored in the hanger and in the process of repair or restoration. Gary gave us an entertaining and informative presentation. I am afraid we may have made him miss his lunch. It is obvious that these old aircraft are his passion and that he wants to honor the men who trained there and fought during WWII. The museum and hanger are open to all Monday through Saturday from 8 am to 5 pm . Gary and Sarah do a great job and if you haven't visited their collection, you should do so next time you are in Corsicana.
