WIENER SCHNITZEL, by Erika Moore

4 Scheiben Kalbskeule zu je 160 g
 1 gestrichener Teel. Salz
 4 gestrichene Eßl. Mehl
 2 Eier
 1 Tasse Semmelbrosel
 6 Eßl. Öl
 1 Zitrone

Das Fleisch muß aus dem sogenannten Schnitzelstück geschnitten werden, ohne

FMCAssist, by Jim McCollum

The replacement for Medex is called FMCAssist. This is the medical evacuation program, at no additional cost to you as a member of FMCA. The new program will start on January 1st. You should look for information in the December magazine. This program is in effect world wide, not just when you are in your motor home. Only requirement is that you are 100 miles from home base.

The new program has more benefits than Medex at a lower cost to FMCA.

In addition there is foreign medical coverage insurance available thru FMCA to cover you when outside the USA. This is available now and can be purchased for as little as one day. Medicare does not cover you outside the USA. There are three levels of coverage. You can find this information on the web site at www.FMCA.com.
